SERVICES FOR STUDENTS WITH DIVERSE NEEDS AND INTENSIVE SUPPORTS

Purpose: The Division recognizes its responsibilities toward the education of students with diverse needs and those who require intensive supports. The Board approves the provision of specialized programming, facilities and services to meet the needs of these students in accordance with *The Education Act, 1995*, and the Saskatchewan Ministry of Education policies and practices.

The Division adheres to the concept of placing students in the most enabling and inclusive environment, which empowers them to be active and contributing participants in the classroom, school and community where engagement and a sense of belonging are both nurtured and promoted.

Procedures:

- 1) Specialized Programs and Services
 - a) The Director of Education or designate is responsible for the implementation, maintenance, and supervision of programs and services for students with diverse needs and intensive supports. The communication of specific programming should be shared with appropriate professional to whom the student is assigned or as directed by the principal.
 - b) The Director of Education or designate has the authority to delegate the implementation and ongoing development and operations of the student support services program to the superintendent, coordinators, consultants, teachers, and other school division employees involved in the delivery of special services.
 - c) The Director of Education or designate is to maintain school division procedures for services for students with diverse needs and intensive supports. These procedures outline in specific detail the delivery system for special education within the school and are consistent with the vision, mission, guiding principles and goals of the school division, and to pertinent policies of the Department of Learning and The Education Act, 1995.

2) Student Placement

a) Students may be directed to attend a school other than a student's designated school, outside the attendance area or school division, where the educational needs of a student with diverse

needs and intensive supports cannot be met in the designated school and the prospective and receiving school has appropriate and available accommodation.

3) Transportation

a) Transportation for students with diverse needs and intensive supports may be provided based on student needs. Consultation for such requests should be made by the principal with the Coordinator in connection with the student's programming
